



Bleach Art Gel FAQ



HOW TO USE:

Prepare Your Fabric Surface

Ensure the fabric is clean and dry. Place an Ink Mat inside the fabric (like a T-shirt) to prevent the bleach gel from bleeding through to the other side and to provide a stable surface.

Position the Stencil

Place the stencil on your fabric over the Ink Mat. Smooth it out to ensure there are no bubbles or wrinkles, especially around the areas where the bleach gel will be applied.

Apply the Bleach Art Gel

Open the container of Bleach Art Gel. Using a squeegee, scoop up some gel and apply it to the stencil. Start at the top of the stencil and work your way down. Use the squeegee to spread the gel evenly across the stencil, applying light pressure to push the gel through the screen.

Remove Excess Gel

After covering the entire stencil area, use the squeegee to remove any excess gel. Scrape off the extra gel and return it to the container. This helps to conserve your materials and ensures a clean application.

Remove the Stencil

Carefully peel the stencil away from the fabric, starting at one corner and pulling it back slowly and evenly. Be careful not to stretch the stencil.

Clean the Stencil

Immediately after use, clean the stencil with cool water in the sink. Gently rub off the bleach gel. Lay the stencil sticky side up to air dry. Once dry, replace the stencil on its backing sheet for storage.

Develop the Bleach Effect

Allow the bleach gel to develop. You can set the fabric outside until the color develops to your liking, or you can use a heat source (like a hairdryer) to speed up the process. Monitor the fabric to achieve the desired effect.

Wash and Dry the Fabric

Once the desired color has been achieved, rinse the fabric thoroughly with cool water in the sink to stop the bleaching process. Wash the fabric according to the care instructions (usually a gentle cycle with cold water) and then dry it.

COMMON QUESTIONS:

Can you use with stencils?

Yes.

Will the Bleach Art Gel stain my stencils?

No, it will not bleach your stencil.

What surfaces can it be used on?

Fabrics; T-Shirts, Sweatshirts, Tote Bags, Table Runners, Canvas Banners, etc.

Does the fabric need to be washed?

Once the desired color has been achieved, rinse the fabric thoroughly with cool water in the sink to stop the bleaching process. Wash the fabric according to the care instructions (usually a gentle cycle with cold water) and then dry it.

Does it have a strong smell?

We wouldn't say strong, but it does have a hint of the bleach smell. Use in a ventilated area. Wash skin with soap and water after use. Keep away from eyes.

Can you use a heat gun to speed up the bleaching process?

You can set the fabric outside until the color develops to your liking, or you can use a heat source (like a heat gun) to speed up the process. Monitor the fabric to achieve the desired effect.

What should be consistency of the Bleach Art Gel

The Bleach Art Gel is a thicker cream colored Gel. It should not be runny.
